We will share the work of groups in a poster session on **Environmental Racism** <u>Tuesday 11/14</u> <u>and Thursday 11/16</u>. We will present in two sessions. When not presenting the rest of the class is responsible for showing up as an attentive and engaged audience.

How to prepare for your poster presentation?

- Come to class with a printed set of pages that we will use to create your poster (more details below)
- Be prepared with a one to two minute (maximum) elevator speech for your topic enough to explain the main idea and leave your listener interested to know more. Be prepared to elaborate and answer questions from your audience

We will be taping your pages to the poster boards. Come to class with a set of printed pages that summarizes your project.

The pages that you should print include the following:

- 1. Topic/Place, Your Names
- 2. Overview
  - A. Heading: "Overview"
  - B. A few bullet points that explain your topic and your argument
- 3. Context
- A. Heading: "Context"
- B. Three to five bullet points that provide **essential background** for your topic/place
- 4. Analysis
- A. Heading: Analysis
- B. A description of your central examples and your analysis
- 5. Conclusions
  - A. Heading "Conclusions"
  - B. Two or three bullet points that address the significance of your argument. So what?
- 6. Bibliography (in Chicago format)
  - A. Heading "Bibliography"
  - B. A list of the key **primary sources** that you have
- 7. Photographs to illustrate (these can fit in between the pages on your poster)
  - A. print on separate pages or cut out photographs

■ Don't use a lot of words! This should be a very condensed summary of your topic

## And a note for the audience:

- Please don't leave class during the poster session
- Your role is to be engaged listeners listen carefully to the brief pitch, read the poster, and ask questions of the presenter about the work they have done
